BYLAW NO. 2303

Being a Bylaw to Amend the Fees and Charges Bylaw No. 2256

WHEREAS the Council of the City of Revelstoke has adopted Fees and Charges Bylaw No. 2256;

AND WHEREAS Council has deemed it desirable to amend fees and charges in respect to the annual review.

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the City of Revelstoke, Province of British Columbia, in open meeting assembled **ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:**
