

THE CORPORATION OF THE VILLAGE OF SILVERTON

BYLAW NO. 355

A Bylaw to regulate traffic and the
use of all highways within the boundaries
of the Village of Silverton

WHEREAS the Council is authorized, pursuant to Section 120 of the *Motor Vehicle Act* and Sections 543 and 545 - 548 inclusive of the *Municipal Act*, to regulate traffic and the use of highways within the Municipality.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Municipal Council of the Village of Silverton, in open meeting assembled, enacts as follows:

PART I - TITLE

- 101. This Bylaw may be cited for all purposes as "Traffic and Highways Regulation Bylaw No. 355, 1998".

PART II - REPEAL

- 201. "Traffic and Highways Regulation Bylaw No. 339, 1996" and all amendments thereto is hereby repealed in its entirety.

PART III - EFFECTIVE DATE

- 301. This Bylaw shall take effect upon adoption by Council.

PART IV - INTERPRETATION

- 401. In this Bylaw, unless the context otherwise requires,
 - (1) the expressions and definitions contained within the *Motor Vehicle Act*, the *Motor Carrier Act*, the *Highway Act*, the *Municipal Act*, the *Interpretation Act* and the *Commercial Transport Act* and regulations thereto, shall be applicable and the following additional interpretations shall prevail throughout:
 - (2) wherever the male gender is used it shall mean the female and visa versa and wherever the singular is used it shall mean the plural and visa versa.

“Access” means a driveway intended for ingress and/or egress to abutting property from a highway.

“Boulevard” means the area other than a sidewalk between the curb lines of a roadway or the lateral lines of a roadway or the shoulder thereof and the adjacent property line.

"Clerk" means the person duly appointed as such from time to time by Council, and includes any person appointed or designated by the Clerk to act on his/her behalf.

“Commercial Vehicle” means a Commercial Vehicle defined as such under the Commercial Transport Act.

"Council" means the Municipal Council of the Village of Silverton.

"Emergency Vehicle" means;

- (a) A motor vehicle carrying rescue, fire or first aid equipment where there is an urgent emergency justifying a rate of speed in excess of any rate of speed provided for in this Bylaw or the Motor Vehicle Act;
- (b) A motor vehicle driven by a Peace Officer, Constable or member of the Police Branch of Her Majesty's Armed Forces in the discharge of his/her duties.

"Extraordinary Traffic" includes carriage of goods or persons over a highway whether in vehicles drawn by animal power or propelled by other means, that in conjunction with the nature or existing condition of the highway is so extraordinary or improper in the quality or quantity of the goods or the number of persons carried, or in the mode or time of use of the highway, or in the speed at which the vehicles are driven or operated, as, in the opinion of the Council, substantially alters or increases the burden imposed on the highway through its proper use by ordinary traffic, and causes damage and expense to the highway beyond what is reasonable or ordinary.

"Hazardous Materials" means any explosive, flammable, toxic, noxious or other harmful or hazardous materials, including dynamite, concentrated chemicals in either solid, liquid or gaseous form, pressurized gases, gasoline and diesel fuel.

"Highway" includes every highway, or boulevard within the meaning of the Highway Act, excluding highways classified as Arterial under the Highway Act, and every road street, lane or right-of-way designed or intended for or used by the general public for the passage of persons and vehicles and every private place or passageway to which the public for the purpose of the parking or servicing of vehicles has access or is invited, and every place or passageway owned or operated by the Village of Silverton for the use of pedestrian traffic.

"Lane" means a public highway within the ordinary meaning of lane not designed for general travel and primarily used as a means of temporary access to the rear of residences and business establishments.

"Licensed Gross Vehicle Weight" means the gross vehicle weight for which a Commercial Vehicle is licensed under the *Commercial Transport Act*.

"Motor Vehicle" means a vehicle, not run upon rails, that is designed to be self propelled.

"Offence Notice" means a Notice of Traffic Violation

"Operator" means any person who drives, operates, propels, or is in physical control of a vehicle, and shall be deemed to include the person in whose name the vehicle is registered.

"Owner" means

- (i) the person who holds the legal title to the vehicle;
- (ii) the person who is entitled to be and is in possession of the vehicle;
- (iii) the person in whose name the vehicle is registered.

"Park" means the stopping or standing of a vehicle whether occupied or not.

"Peace Officer" means a police officer, police constable, constable or other person employed for the preservation and maintenance of the public peace and includes any person appointed by Council to enforce the provisions of this bylaw.

"Pedestrian" means a person afoot, or an invalid or child in a wheelchair or carriage.

"Permit" means a document in writing issued pursuant to this bylaw.

"Persons" means human beings, male or female, and includes a company or body corporate.

"Public Works Foreman" means the person appointed as such by council, and any person delegated to assist him in carrying out his duties under this bylaw.

"Road Closure Permit" means a permit which authorizes the closure of a highway or portion of a highway.

"Shoulder" means the portion of the highway between the travelled portion of an uncurbed highway and the ditch; or if there is no ditch, the area between the travelled portion of the highway and the boulevard.

"Sidewalk" means the area between the curb-lines or lateral lines of a highway and the adjacent property lines improved for the use of pedestrians or any other improved area set aside for pedestrian use only.

"Traffic" includes pedestrians, ridden or herded animals, vehicles, cycles and other conveyances, either singly or together, while using a highway for purposes of travel.

"Traffic Control Device" means a sign, signal, line, marking, space, barrier, or device, not inconsistent with this bylaw, placed or erected by authority of the Minister of Transportation and Highways, or of the council or person duly authorized by the Minister of Transportation and Highways or the Council to exercise such authority.

"Truck Route" means a highway, or portion thereof, that is designated for use by Extraordinary Traffic.

"Vehicle" means any device or means of conveyance in, upon, or by which a person or thing is or may be transported or drawn upon a highway, except a device designed to be moved by human power or used exclusively upon stationary rails or tracks.

"Vehicle Government" means any truck or equipment in excess of 10,000 kilograms owned and operated by a federal, provincial, or local government or its contractors.

"Vehicle Utility" means any truck or equipment in excess of 10,000 kilograms owned and operated by a person or contractor in the business of providing utility services to the residents of the Village and surrounding area.

"Village" means The Corporation of the Village of Silverton or the territory under the jurisdiction of the Corporation of the Village of Silverton.

PART V - AUTHORITIES

501. THE CLERK:

- (1) may, issue, or cause to be issued, permits required pursuant to the provisions of this Bylaw.
- (2) may, issue or cause to be issued, offence notices for violations of this Bylaw.
- (3) may, impound, or cause to be impounded, any vehicle, trailer or cycle in violation of this Bylaw.

502. **THE PUBLIC WORKS FOREMAN:**

- (1) may, on any highway, place or erect or cause to be placed or erected, traffic control devices to regulate or prohibit traffic where deemed necessary to ensure the orderly movement of traffic, or to prevent injury or damage to persons or property or to prevent injury or damage to the highway and where such traffic control devices are so placed or erected, they shall have the same force and effect as if placed by resolution of Council.
- (2) may, regulate the use of vehicles not equipped with chains, snow tires, or sanding devices.
- (3) is hereby authorized and empowered by order to place, replace or alter traffic control devices at any location he may determine to give effect to the provisions of the *Motor Vehicle Act* and this Bylaw.
- (4) is hereby authorized and empowered to issue or cause to be issued, offence notices for violations of this Bylaw.
- (5) may, impound, or caused to be impounded, any vehicle, trailer or cycle that is in violation of this Bylaw.

503. **PEACE OFFICERS,**

- (1) may, issue offence notices for violations of this Bylaw.
- (2) may, direct and regulate traffic in any manner deemed necessary and in doing so, may disregard any traffic control devices.
- (3) may, impound, or caused to be impounded, any vehicle, trailer or cycle that is in violation of this Bylaw.
- (4) may, require the driver of any vehicle to weigh such vehicle at any weigh scale forthwith.

PART VI - GENERAL TRAFFIC REGULATIONS

601. **Application:**

Unless the context otherwise requires,

- (1) The provisions of this Bylaw do not apply to persons, vehicles and to other equipment while actually engaged in highway construction or maintenance work upon, under or over the surface of a highway while at the site of the work, but do apply to them when travelling to or from the site of the work.
- (2) A person riding an animal or driving an animal drawn vehicle upon a highway has all the rights and is subject to the provisions of this Bylaw.

602. **Conformance:**

No person shall park, drive or operate a vehicle or cycle in contravention of a traffic control device.

603. **Damage to Devices:**

No person shall remove or alter any traffic control device.

604. **Obey Commands:**

Every person shall at all times comply with any lawful order, direction, signal, or command made or given by a police officer, fireman, ambulance attendant, flag person or school patrol.

605. **Speed Limits - Highway:**

Unless otherwise posted, and except in School and Playground Zones, which will be thirty (30) kilometres per hour, the maximum speed on any highway in the Village of Silverton shall be forty (40) kilometres per hour.

606. **Speed Limits - Lane:**

No person shall operate a vehicle on a lane at a greater rate of speed than twenty (20) kilometres per hour.

607. **Speed Limits - Construction:**

No person shall operate a vehicle within a construction zone at a speed greater than twenty (20) kilometres per hour, unless otherwise posted.

608. **Damage to Sidewalks:**

- (1) No person operating a vehicle shall park, drive on, over or upon any sidewalk, curb or boulevard so as to encumber, obstruct, or damage same.
- (2) When a sidewalk crossing is not available, crossing by a vehicle will be permitted upon adequate provision being made to protect the sidewalk or boulevard from damage by the use of suitable planking or other material, having due consideration for the size and weight of the vehicle and load.

609. **Blocking Intersections:**

No person operating a vehicle shall block an intersection or a crosswalk, notwithstanding any traffic control device.

610. **Vehicle Wheels:**

- (1) No person shall drive any vehicle of any kind having wheel, tires or tracks constructed or equipped with projecting spikes, cleats, ribs, clamps, flanges, lugs or other attachments or projections engaging the roadway along, on or across any bridge or hard surface highway within the Village, without first obtaining the written permission from Public Works Foreman who shall determine which bridges and highways may be used and the conditions of such use. Nothing herein contained shall be construed as prohibiting the use of tire chains or studded winter tires.
- (2) The Public Works Foreman may, by public notice or by the placing of signs on highways, regulate the operation of vehicles which are not equipped with chains or winter tires or sanding devices or any combination of these which may be considered adequate and necessary in view of the prevailing highway conditions and no person shall drive any vehicle in contravention of such notice or signs.

611. **Extraordinary Traffic:**

- (1) Any truck or equipment exceeding 10,000 kilograms shall not be permitted to travel on any residential street within the municipal boundaries of the Village except government or utility vehicles while engaged in work upon roadways, or trucks or equipment travelling through the Village to perform routine maintenance or emergency services outside the Village, or trucks delivering goods and materials to properties on a street or streets directly serviced by the roadway.
- (2) Every person operating a truck or heavy equipment exceeding 10,000 kilograms upon a highway as authorize under subsection 611.(1), shall travel by the closest and most direct route to the destination of the trip upon entering or leaving the Village.
- (3) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Bylaw, the Council shall have the discretion to determine and establish appropriate "truck routes" within the Village from time as deemed necessary and in the public interest, for vehicles and equipment in excess of 10,000 kgs.
- (4) The following routes have been designated as "Truck Routes" within the Village of Silverton, as outlined in Appendix 1 attached hereto and forming part of this Bylaw; and, are subject to the provisions of Sections 611(5) - 611(9):
4th Street; Alpha Street; Silverton Creek Road;
Leadville Street; 6th Street; and, Standard Road.
- (5) The Public Works Foreman may post signs or may cause signs to be posted on Highways in the Village to notify persons using the highways of regulations, limits or prohibitions with respect to Extraordinary Traffic made under the authority of this bylaw.
- (6) The following restrictions on Extraordinary Traffic may be placed on the designated truck routes, unless otherwise resolved by Council:
Days of Operation: Monday to Friday
Hours of Operation: 7:00 am to 5:00 pm
Speed Limit: 30 km/hr
- (7) The Public Works Foreman may cause a highway to be close to traffic or use at a time and for a period of time and for classes of traffic or use as he believes may be necessary for construction or protection of the Highway or other public work or for the protection of persons using the Highway or to enable traffic permitted on the highway to be handled safely and expeditiously.
- (8) This Bylaw does not apply to a person who, with the approval of the Council, enters into an agreement with the Village for payment to the Village of compensation for the damage or expenses which may be caused by the Extraordinary Traffic.
- (9) No person shall drive on or use a Highway in the Village contrary to an agreement, order, regulation, limitation or prohibition made under this Bylaw.

612. **Load Limits:**

No person shall without a permit issued under authority of this Bylaw, and subject to the provisions of this Bylaw, operate on a highway a vehicle or combination of vehicles and trailers having a weight not conforming to the requirements of the *Commercial Transport Act* and Regulations thereto.

613. **Vehicle Size:**

No person shall, without a permit, and subject to the provisions of this Bylaw, operate on a highway, a vehicle or combination of vehicles and trailers having a size not conforming to the requirements of the *Motor Vehicle Act* and *Commercial Transport Act* and Regulations thereto.

614. **Traffic and Load Restrictions:**

Where in the opinion of the Public Works Foreman any highway is liable to damage through extraordinary traffic thereon, the Public Works Foreman may regulate, limit or prohibit the use of the highway by any person operating or in charge of the extraordinary traffic or owning the goods carried therein or the vehicles used therein.

615. **Highway Closure Permit:**

- (1) Temporary Highway Closure Permits may be issued by the Clerk to persons requiring partial or complete closure of a highway for the purposes of construction on or adjacent to a highway.
- (2) There shall be no charge for the permit except in the case of any direct costs incurred due to traffic control or like services provided by the Village.

616. **Removal of Offence Notice:**

No person, other than the owner or operator of a vehicle, shall remove from a vehicle any offence notice issued under authority of this Bylaw.

617. **Impoundment of Vehicles:**

- (1) Where a vehicle is standing or parked,
 - (a) in violation of any of the provisions of this Bylaw;
 - (b) in a position that causes it to interfere with the removal of snow, ice or sand from a highway, sidewalk or boulevard;
 - (c) in a position that causes it to interfere with firefighting;
 - (d) in a position that causes it to interfere with the normal flow of traffic on a highway;
 - (e) in a position that causes it to interfere with the construction, improvement, alteration, extension, widening, marking repair or maintenance of a highway;
 - (f) apparently abandoned on a highway;
 - (g) without proper or valid licence plates displayed as required by the *Motor Vehicle Act*,

The Public Works Foreman or a Peace Officer may,

- (a) move the vehicle, or require the driver or person in charge of such vehicle to move it to a position determined by the Public Works Foreman.

- (b) move the vehicle or take the vehicle into custody of the Village and cause it to be taken to and stored in a safe and otherwise suitable location.
- (2) All costs and charges for the removal, care and storage of a vehicle removed and impounded under this Section shall be paid by the owner of the vehicle and shall be a lien thereon in favour of the keeper of any repair shop, garage or storage place in which such vehicle is stored and the same may be enforced in the manner provided by the *Mechanic's Lien Act, Warehousemen's Lien Act, Highways Scenic Improvement Act or Municipal Act*.

PART VII - PARKING REGULATIONS

701. Unlawful Parking:

- (1) No person shall park a vehicle in any public place unless such person shall comply with all provisions of this Bylaw and other regulations posted by traffic control devices.
- (2)
 - (a) Where a motor vehicle or trailer is left, without the consent of the occupier of private property within the Village, the owner of a motor vehicle or trailer shall be deemed to have authorized and empowered the occupier to be his agent for the purpose of towing the motor vehicle or trailer to a place of storage and storing it;
 - (b) The agent has a lien against the motor vehicle or trailer for all reasonable advances made or charges incurred in connection with the towing and storing of the motor vehicle or trailer in the course of the agency;
 - (c) The procedure respecting enforcement of the lien shall be governed by the *Warehouse Lien Act*.

702. Time Limits:

Notwithstanding any other provisions of this Bylaw, no person shall park a vehicle on any highway for longer than seventy-two (72) hours continuously.

703. Prohibited Parking:

- (1) Except when necessary to avoid conflict with traffic, or to comply with the law, or the directions of a peace officer, or traffic control device, no person shall stop, stand, or park a vehicle,
 - (a) on a sidewalk or boulevard;
 - (b) in front of, nor within one (1) meter of a public or private driveway in a residential, commercial or industrial zone;
 - (c) within an intersection;
 - (d) within five (5) meters of a fire hydrant;
 - (e) on a crosswalk;
 - (f) within six (6) meters of a crosswalk or an intersection or any flashing beacon, stop sign, or traffic control signal located at the side of a highway;

- (g) within fifteen (15) meters of the nearest rail of a railway crossing;
- (h) Upon any highway for the purposes of,
 - (i) displaying a vehicle for sale;
 - (ii) advertising, greasing, painting, wrecking, storing, or repairing any vehicle, except where repairs are necessitated by an emergency;
 - (iii) displaying signs;
 - (iv) selling any product;

Except with the prior written approval of Council.

- (i) alongside or opposite a highway excavation or obstruction when stopping, standing or parking obstructs traffic;
 - (j) upon a bridge or other elevated structure on a highway, except as permitted by a traffic control device;
 - (k)
 - (i) on a highway in such a manner as to obstruct or impede the normal flow of traffic;
 - (ii) on a marked lane of a laned highway.
 - (l) in a place in contravention of a traffic control device that gives notice that stopping, standing or parking is prohibited or restricted;
 - (m) in such a manner as to obstruct the visibility of any standard traffic sign;
 - (n) on any portion of a street where lines, markings or other signs are placed indicating the manner in which vehicles shall be parked, except in accordance with such lines, markings or other signs;
- (2) No person shall move a vehicle that is not lawfully under their control, into any of the places mentioned in Section 703.(1).

704. **Double Parking:**

No person shall double park a vehicle on a highway.

705. **Trailer Parking:**

No person shall park any trailer upon any highway unless in emergency situations or the trailer is attached to a vehicle by which it may be propelled or drawn.

706. **Hazardous Materials:**

No person shall park or leave unattended, a vehicle or trailer loaded or unloaded and used for the conveyance of hazardous materials, except,

- (1) at secured chemical plants;
- (2) at repair garages - for service only;
- (3) at other approved secured areas.

PART VIII - USE OF HIGHWAY REGULATIONS

801. **Snow Removal:**

- (1) No person shall deposit, pile or spread snow or ice cleaned from roofs, parking lots, car lots, automobile service stations or garages, or any other surface or property, on any highway, sidewalk, boulevard, or other public place, except the place designated by the Public Works Foreman.
- (2) Nothing herein contained shall be construed as prohibiting the Village from plowing snow to the property line of any highway or from removing such plowed snow.

802. **Drainage:**

No person shall alter or stop the flow of water through any drain, sewer ditch or culvert on any highway.

803. **Littering:**

- (1) No person shall operate on a highway, a vehicle or combination of vehicle and trailer unless it is so constructed, loaded, or covered as to prevent any of its load from dropping, shifting, leaking, or otherwise escaping therefrom.
- (2) Should any material, due to any cause whatsoever, fall from the vehicle, the operator shall forthwith take all reasonable precautions to safeguard traffic from the consequences thereof and shall remove such material from the spillage area.
- (3) No person shall place, throw, deposit or discard on any highway, any rubbish, litter or waste material of any description.

804. **Construction:**

- (1) No person shall excavate, construct any works, or occupy the highway for the purposes of construction adjacent to any highway unless otherwise authorized by permit.
- (2) Where authorized works are carried out on, over or under any highway, appropriate signs, flashers, barricades or other warning devices shall be provided around the construction zone to the satisfaction of the Village.

805. **Impeding Traffic, Damage to Highways:**

- (1) No person shall cut, saw, break, split, place or pile firewood, lumber, blocks, stone, debris or other material or mix mortar on any highway.
- (2) No person shall use any highway for any purpose other than that of lawful traffic, except with the permission of the Clerk or the Public Works Foreman.
- (3) No operator of a vehicle shall drive through any military or funeral procession, nor through the ranks of any other authorized parade or procession or in any way obstruct, impede or interfere with such procession or parade.

806. **Noise and Advertising:**

No person shall operate upon a vehicle, any calliope, loudspeaker or other noise making device upon the streets of the Village for advertising or other purposes unless approval has been granted by the Council.

807. **Structures Over Highways:**

- (1) No person shall, except as provided herein or by any other bylaw, or unless otherwise authorized by Council, erect or maintain any structure which encroaches on or over any highway or public land.
- (2) Approved structures overhanging the highway shall have a minimum clearance of 2.5 meters above any sidewalk or walkway and 5 meters above any roadway.
- (3) No person shall place, erect, remove or alter any sign, structure or other device on or over a street or land without the express consent of Council.
- (4) Every person who in any way damages any pavement, paved or unpaved sidewalk or curbing while leaving the travelled portion of the street, shall be liable to the Village and shall pay for the cost of repairing such damage to the satisfaction of Council.

808. **Public Utilities:**

- (1) No person or gas, telephone, hydro electric, telegraph, pipeline company, radio or television broadcasting company or closed circuit television company shall use the streets in the Village for the construction and installation of the aforementioned utilities unless they have first supplied the Village with complete plans and specifications of the proposed work to be constructed or installed and have in turn received written permission from the Village.
- (2) All construction undertaken by any utility company under the provisions of this Section shall be in accordance with the applicable Bylaws of the Village and all applicable Provincial and Federal legislation.
- (3) Where a utility is granted a permit under this Section, the utility shall erect and maintain a good and sufficient fence, railing or barricade around every excavation, construction or installation in such a manner as to prevent accidents, and shall place and keep upon such fence, railing or barricade, suitable and sufficient lights during the night and shall take such further care and precaution as the Village may deem necessary for the safety of the public.

PART IX - PENALTIES

901. **Offence Defined:**

- (1) Every person who violates any of the provisions of this Bylaw or who suffers or permits any act or thing to be done in contravention of this Bylaw, or who refuses, or omits or neglects to fulfil, observe, carry out or perform any duty or obligation imposed by this Bylaw shall be deemed to have committed an offence against this bylaw and shall be liable to a fine of not less than Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars, nor more than Two Thousand (\$2,000.00) Dollars for each offence.
- (2) Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, where any offence notice is issued pursuant to the provisions of this bylaw, any person may:
 - (a) if paid within seven (7) days of the issuance of the offence notice, pay to the Village, the sum of Twenty-Five (\$25.00) Dollars as full satisfaction for each offence.
 - (b) after seven (7) days of the issuance of the offence notice, pay to the Village, the sum of Fifty (\$50.00) as full satisfaction for each offence.

902. **Responsibility of Owner:**

- (1) The owner of a vehicle shall incur the penalties provided for any offence of this bylaw with respect to any vehicle owned by him, unless at the time of such offence the vehicle was in the possession of some person other than the owner without the owner's consent; but nothing in this section shall relieve the operator of a vehicle not being the owner, from incurring the penalties provided for such offence.
- (2) The onus of establishing that the vehicle was in the possession of some person other than the owner rests with the owner.

903. **Default:**

In addition to any other penalty which may be incurred, anyone failing to comply with the provisions of this Bylaw within the time limited therefor, or within a reasonable time upon notice to that effect by the Village, shall be subject to the Village carrying out any such work, by its work crews or others, at the expense of the offender and any charges or costs incurred by the Village in this regard, shall be recoverable in any Court of competent jurisdiction.

TRAFFIC AND HIGHWAYS REGULATION BYLAW NO. 355, 1997

**SCHEDULE "A" - FEE SCHEDULE
REMOVAL OF CHATTEL, OBSTRUCTIONS AND VEHICLES**

1. The following fees, costs and expenses shall be paid by the owner of any chattel, obstruction or vehicle removed, detained or impounded pursuant to this Bylaw.
 - (a)
 - (i) Removal of any vehicles - see fee schedule listed in table below. If the rates in the ICBC Towing Rate Payment Schedule exceed those listed below, ICBC rates shall prevail (plus \$20.00 administration fee).
 - (ii) Any additional charges which may be incurred due to unusual circumstances will be in accordance with the ICBC Towing Rate Payment schedule for the current year.
 - (b) for storing vehicles in private storage yards:
 - (i) automobiles, including panel and pickup trucks - \$7.00/day.
 - (ii) heavy trucks, tractors or trailers - \$10.00/day.
 - (iii) if the storage rates exceed the amounts listed above but are in accordance with the ICBC Payment Schedule, the ICBC rates shall prevail.
 - (c)
 - (i) for any chattel weighing under 45 kg and less than 1 m in any one dimension, the actual cost of removal of the chattel, plus a storage fee per day, or any part thereof of \$2.00.
 - (ii) minimum charge \$10.00.
 - (d) for any obstruction, the total cost of removal of the obstruction plus the cost of disposing of the obstruction plus towing fees as established in the fee schedule below.
 - (e) if ICBC rates exceed any rates listed in this Schedule, ICBC rates shall prevail.
